




Conflict

You want to leave now - your children don't want to leave yet.


You want to use system A – and your coworker wants to use system B

Conflict & Reorganisation




Higher levels Context

Conflict level *Goals*

Lower levels Symptoms

Reorganisation

- Pause efforts
- Focus attention
- Consider all systems involved



- Insight
- New perspective



How to help reorganisation to take place?



- Don't take away control
- Curiosity! Explore all sides of the problem
- Notice everything: emotions, thoughts, imagery
- Sustain attention where it hurts

Applying PCT in your context



- What perceptions are people trying to control?
- Are there persistent conflicting goals?
- How can we facilitate reorganisation at the higher level?
